Surrounded by her loving family, Pat passed away peacefully on February 6, 2019, at the age of 81, after a brief battle with cancer. After raising her three boys, she returned to nursing as a school nurse and health teacher at Brentwood High School. Pat was known for her amazing decorations for numerous Brentwood proms. She would later return to school and receive her masters degree from Webster University.

Pat's outgoing and positive attitude was contagious. A hands on go-getter with many hobbies, she enjoyed jewelry making, Indian art, tennis, gardening, sewing, entertaining, hunting & fishing, bridge, square dancing, travel and painting.

She was never afraid of hard work or tackling challenging tasks. At the farm, where she liked to fish and hunt, she also found time to run the tractor, plant pecan trees, clear brush, and put in vegetable gardens.

Pat adored her family and delighted in the many summer family vacations to Destin, Florida and occasionally more adventurous vacations like rock-hounding out West and a self-guided canoeing trip in the Canadian wilderness.

She had a relentless positive spirit, an always cheerful and outgoing disposition, and a servant's loving heart. She will be greatly missed by all who were fortunate enough to have known her.
