Andrew E Lindberg, of Grover, Missouri, was born April 6, 1942 in Saint Louis, Missouri to Caryl and Mildred (Montgomery) Lindberg and went to be with the Lord Monday, May 4, 2020 at Surry Place in Chesterfield, Missouri at the age of 78 years, 0 months and 28 days.

He is survived by his brother David (Rebecca) A Lindberg of Allen TX and niece Sara E. Harris and nephew Steven M. Lindberg along with many cousins and friends.

Andy grew up in Glendale Missouri and went to North Glendale elementary school, Nipher Junior High and graduated from Kirkwood Senior High. Andy went on to attend Washington University and achieved a Master's of Science degree in mechanical engineering in 1967. Later he obtained a professional engineering license and was member of American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) and National Society of Professional Engineers. Andy was a faculty member at the St. Louis Community College for 10 years and later worked for the original Monsanto Company Inc. and later retired from Solutia Inc. in 2001 as a Principal Engineer.

Andy was a member of the Webster Groves Christian Church for all of his adult life where he was an elder and sang in the church and other choirs in the St. Louis area. Andy was a member of Gideon's International organization for

37 years. He also volunteered as an alternate member of the Wildwood Architecture Review Board.

Hobbies included singing, gardening, wood and metal working.

He will be fondly remembered and dearly missed by all who knew and loved him.

A memorial service is to be planned for a future date. Andy will be interred at the Oak Hill Cemetery in Kirkwood Mo.
