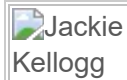

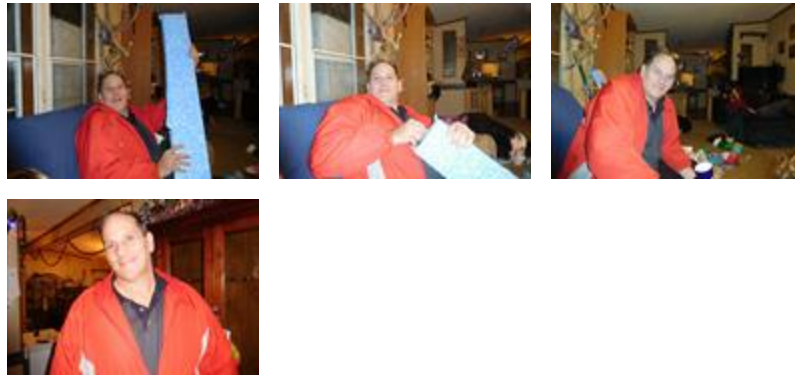

I stayed home to care for Brian not yet in school, and to get the other boys off to school. Brian and I rode around some days on the little Honda motorcycle John had given me. We went to garage sales, rode around the neighborhood, and passed time waiting to meet the other boys after school. He was also very close to my dog Sam. They were real buddies. He dressed Sam in clothes and they played very close. He was taking care of Sam and seeing to his needs. It was really cute to see them together. He was almost 16 when we lost our Mom. This was devastating to all of us. Losing Dad when the boys were young was hard, but Mom gave it her all and did a fine job with them. She loved them dearly, as they did her. She was a wonderful Mother. This influenced Brian and fueled his desire to be a good parent to his future children. I became his legal guardian, but Brian and his brothers held the Lang family together in the family home. He promised his Mom he would graduate high school, and that he did. Once a week we would spend the day together. We'd go to lunch, go shopping, or just hang around and talk about school, home, or whatever else he had on his mind. What I remember most about our conversations was his position on his future as a parent. He didn't have a girlfriend yet but he knew parenting was in his future. He told me on multiple occasions he wished to have six kids!! It wasn't a whim. He was serious. Six kids!! He was the youngest of six kids so I could see where he was coming from. I thought that was admirable in a young man. He also wanted his own home and his own business to raise and support these children. He accomplished all those things for his family. To say I was proud of him was an understatement! Things happen in our lives to change the direction of some of our desires and life plans. To love his eight children and their children remained his goal for the rest of his life. That is exactly what he did. He learned love from our parents, and gave all the love he could to his own children. Steven, Katie, Tim, Matt, Joshua,

*Rebecca, Hannah, and Danielle.....I want you to know.....all eight of you. I did tease him regularly he couldn't count. I'd tell him he said six kids. He would correct me and tell me he said "at least six".....He loved each and every one of you with all his heart. Keep that with you the rest of your life. Pass this kind of love onto your own children like his parents did to him. I'm proud of him and loved him like my own child. The song says " a sister will do when the Mother is dead son". My only wish is to have done him well. May Peace be with you Brian. You have left a fine legacy. I know they will do their best to make you proud.
