Dudley M Campbell (76) of Dallas, Texas, died peacefully surrounded by his loving family on Monday, October 3, 2022, following an extended illness. He was preceded in death by his parents William W Campbell, Sr, and Jeanne H. Campbell, Stepmother Maxine F. Campbell, and brother Hugh L. Campbell. Dudley is survived by his son Evan M. Campbell (Debra) and grandson Parker, brother William W. Campbell, Jr, (Alexis), sister-in-law Donna F. Campbell (Hugh), many cousins, and long-time devoted friend, Carol Beatty. He is greatly missed by his family and many friends.

Dudley was born January 4, 1947, in St Louis, MO, grew up in Bay Village, Ohio, and was a 1965 graduate of Bay Village High School. He graduated from the University of Cincinnati in 1970 with a degree in Industrial Design. Dudley spent a number of years in consumer product marketing and packaging design at Proctor & Gamble in Cincinnati and later at Frito-Lay in Dallas as Art Director. He was an avid motorsports racing fan, eventually taking up motorcycle racing. A 1983 racing accident resulted in paraplegia. The need for a wheelchair did not stop him from keeping his humor and enjoying a full life.

After his rewarding years at Frito-Lay, Dudley started his own successful consumer products packaging design consulting business, Campbell Design

Associates, which he operated for 34 years until his retirement in early 2022. His clients included a number of well known national & regional brands. Dudley was known by his business associates and clients to be highly creative and a consummate professional.

A pro sports fan, he attended many Dallas games in person. His enjoyment of auto sports racing continued throughout his life, and traveled to various racing events in the US and Europe. Dudley eventually re-entered the sports car racing world with a hand-controlled VW GTI set up for racing, and participated in many club racing events across the US. On a personal basis he was regarded as a person of high integrity and having a generous spirit. He greatly appreciated the support he received over the years from friends, family, church, and business associates and clients. Dudley was a long-time active member of the Fifth Church of Christ Scientist.
