above all, his greatest joy in life was his family. His children were his world, and every beat of his heart belonged to them. He was proud of his family and the bond they shared. Scotty loved so fiercely, without limits, and he left an imprint within all who knew him that will never fade. He will be missed beyond measure, but his legacy will live on through his passions, his memories, and the laughter we all knew from him - a laugh we will never forget. His soul will echo forever in the lives that he has touched.

His adventurous spirit began the day he was born in the front seat of a Datsun B210 on the way to the hospital – a fitting start to a life lived with spontaneity and profoundness. He came into this world boldly and left it just the same.
