*So fun to read your comments. I remember the camper too...I was thinking we went to Johnsons Shut In...not sure of that name but regardless, we always giggled and had tons of fun! Here is the Strawberry Mousse:*

*1 large box of strawberry Jell-O  
1 package frozen strawberries, you can get pureed or whole, I use the whole and smash them because that's all I could get. Defrost  
1/2 pint or one small tub of Cool Whip*

*Prepare Jell-O using a little less water to allow for the strawberry juice (I used the juice in my measurements to be precise)  
When thick but not set whip it a bit. Add the Cool Whip and strawberries. Mix and Chill*
