April 11, 1924 - August 12, 2025

Jacqueline Cannon Gable, born April 11, 1924, died on August 12, 2025 in St. Louis, Missouri. She graduated from Soldan High School, William Woods College (Fulton, MO), and Washington University with a B.A. in Education, prior to being married to L. John Gable on March 28, 1947 at Westminster Presbyterian Church in St. Louis.

Jacqueline and John lived their lives in Webster Groves, where they raised their four children: Linda, Deb, Cynthia, and John. She was a founding member of South Webster Presbyterian Church. She was active in the music ministries and the Early Childhood Center of Webster Groves Presbyterian Church, where she started a prayer shawl ministry and directed and rang in the bell choirs. She was a founding member of the Pitch Pipers, a women's choral group under the direction of Esther Replogle and Gene Symes.

Along with her husband, Jacqueline was honored by the American Cancer Society for her volunteer work with the organization. She also enjoyed knitting and gardening.

Jacqueline is survived by her children, Linda (Bob) Watson of Decorah IA, Deb (Gary) Stratman of Springfield MO, Cynthia (Scott) Blasor of College Station TX, and John (Kristin) Gable of Indianapolis IN.
