Jerome Russell Davis, age 86, beloved husband of Dorothy Farmer Davis and devoted father to Robert, Diane, Christopher, Andrew, and deceased daughter Laura. Sales Manager at Comfort Printing before becoming Founder and President of Davis Communications, Jerry was active in Webster Hills United Methodist Church, where he served in leadership roles in the Contemporary Class and on various stewardship Boards. He was widely known in Webster Groves and St Louis to be a strong supporter of the Business Community and the Republican Party through his activities as past national President of the Pachyderms. He was also an enthusiastic supporter of the St Louis Acting Community, in recognition of his wife Dorothy's acting career, and a committed advocate for the power of communication, reflected in his work with Toastmasters and Dale Carnegie. A passionate advocate for the Boy Scouts, he received both the Order of the Arrow and the Silver Beaver Award, organizing with other Dads a 50 year Reunion of Troop 302. Proud father of three Eagle Scout sons Robert, Christopher, and Andrew, and his daughter Diane, a Harvard professor, Jerome also served his Country with distinction and received medals from the US Navy for his contributions as an officer during the Korean War.
