“ When I had her as my Senior English teacher at Northwest, she was still Miss Buford, and so I always think of her that way. She was a tremendous teacher. In fact, I know that I have often thought of her teaching while I've prepared my own classes. To be a role model without even knowing it is a fine thing. She was and remains, in my life at least, an enduring role model. I know she would have been pleased with my career and only regret that I saw her only once after high school, and that was only a few years after graduation. We had a student teacher for part of the year I was in her class, and like all students who somehow think they are defending their "real" teacher's territory, we were hard on her. I remember vividly how, after that student teacher had finished up, Miss Buford stood in front of the class and said this: "I am so very ashamed of the way you treated her. She deserved your best, not your worst." When we protested that the student wasn't nearly as good as our real teacher, Miss Buford said, "No. You are wrong. She will be a fine teacher. I just wish she had seen what a fine class you are. I do not believe she did." She was wonderful and strong and smart and honest. More than that, and I think you can see this from all of the signatures and memories, she affected the lives of so many of her students. I graduated in 1966. Just think how many more students' lives she touched after that. -- My sorrow for your loss; my joy for how long the world got to have her around.
