“ I was friends with Kim and her family while living in Missouri for 10 years. She was my neighbor across the street and Not only was she a wonderful friend but someone who thought of me every time she went out. I do not drive and whether it was a quick run to the post office, a grocery shopping trip, a day at the mall, something cold to drink from Sonic or a meal from Steak and Shake she always made sure to invite me to go with her so that I could get out of the house and get things that I might need or want. I remember her great dislike of spiders, and her calling me one day in a torrential downpour because there had been a spider by her dryer that had not moved and she wanted to finish her laundry. I went across the street with an umbrella that did little good in keeping me from the rain. When I got into the house she was standing at the top of the stairs and pointing in the direction that I needed to look. I am legally blind but I saw what she was talking about right in front of the dryer doors. To me it was a black spot but I took off my shoe and as I approached thought how strange it was that the spider did not move. Smacking the ground hard the spider jumped or at least I thought it did but when it landed something looked off so I reached out and I picked it up, it was a plastic spider! We had a great laugh about that one. Also the time when she called me and said she was parked at the bottom of her driveway because a black snake had slithered into the garage when she opened the door and she didn't even want to go up into the house because she was afraid it might come out. I went over then as well and I looked and we never found it because it had crawled up underneath one of the shelves in the garage but being a barrier between her and the snake at least allowed her to get into the house 😭 since moving away we kept in contact for a while but had lost touch and I am so sorry to hear that she is no longer with us and her family. My husband passed several years ago and I am sure that they are both watching over all of us, reminiscing and will be there to greet us when our time comes.
