Marty grew up in Creve Coeur Lake (originally established by his grandfather). He was pictured in Life Magazine, being rescued by the Red Cross during a severe flood of the Creve Coeur Lake.

Marty, in his earlier years, loved hunting. He would go out frequently with close friends to hunt deer and rabbit.

Marty developed a huge passion for bowling. He spent the last 40 years coaching bowling at Crestwood Bowl. Every Saturday morning, he would participate in the Junior League.

Marty was always friendly and greeted everyone with a smile. He will be fondly remembered and dearly missed by all who knew and loved him.

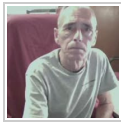
