Mary Jo Robinson (nee Trapp), age 58, wife of Louis Robinson and daughter of the late Richard and Wilma (nee Lange) Trapp, was carried Home on angelâ€™s wings to be with her Lord and Savior on March 13, 2012 at St. Maryâ€™s Health Center in Richmond Heights, MO.

Mary Jo was born July 3, 1953 in Rogers City, Michigan. She attended kindergarten in 1958 at Rogers City Elementary. At the tender age of 6, she attended Michigan School for the Blind in Lansing, MI, graduating in 1972. She furthered her education at Arkansas Enterprises for the Blind in Little Rock, AR receiving certification the summer of 1974 as a tax law specialist. She married Louis Robinson on May 8, 1976 and they resided in Grand Rapids, MI. Mary Jo worked in Detroit, Milwaukee, and retired in 1999 from the St. Louis IRS regional office.

Mary Jo is survived by her husband, Louis, of St. Louis; her sisters, Kaye (Ken) Bellmore of Rogers City, MI and Paula (Tom) Fabis of Alpena, MI; special nieces, Kathryn and Mary Fabis of Detroit, MI; special nephew, Joe Fabis of Annandale, VA; beloved aunts, Betty Krueger and Rosemary Trapp; beloved uncle, John (Donna) Lange; and numerous cousins.

Mary Jo was passionate about music and collecting angels and loved to read. She was a member of Christ in the City Lutheran Church on the campus of St.
