Nancy K. Diley, 72, passed away Thursday, July 14, 2022, at Mercy Hospice House.

Nancy was born in St. Louis, Missouri on December 3, 1949, a daughter of the late David and Gladys Diley.

She had been a very active member of New Heights Christian Church and beloved by all.

Nancy graduated from the University of Missouri with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Home Economics. She worked in the Biology Department at University of Missouri, St. Louis, for Dr. Charles Granger as an Administrative Associate for 37 years.

Nancy was the administrative assistant for more than 25 STEM enhancement outreach programs including the Students and Teachers as Research Scientists (STARS) program and co-director of the annual Missouri Junior Science and Engineering Symposium (JSEHS) where she was responsible for the coordination of four days of activities for more than 300 students and teachers from across the State of Missouri. She was loved and respected by the teachers and students that she served over the 37 years at UMSL. She was a loyal supporter of the University and was an excellent ambassador for the UMSL campus.

Dr. Granger stated “Nancy was extremely organized and efficient in the

execution of multiple programs and multitasking. We could not have mounted more than \$22 million in outreach programs over the years without her professional input and support.”

Nancy enjoyed cooking and entertaining in her home. She was a great example of practicing hospitality.

Nancy is survived by her 2 sisters, Jeanne Diley of Naples, Florida and Sharon Foster of Ballwin, Missouri and her cousin, Janice Kaddatz and her husband John of Bettendorf, Iowa, as well as many friends.
