Born Patricia Ann Steele, in St. Louis, Missouri on October 17th, 1958 at the age of 61, ended a long fight with Cancer. Pat Miller died in her home in Cedar Hill, Missouri the morning of February 25th, 2020. She is survived by her loving husband of 43 years, Jerry Miller Sr., her son Jerry Jr. and wife Dee, her son Jacob and wife Erika, and her daughter Heather. Her love carries on with 7 grandchildren, 1 step grandson, and 2 step granddaughters. Emma Lynn, Haylie Marie, Amber Lynn, Kaelyn Ann, Erika Rose, Christian Matthew, Caden Riley, James, Domi and Brooke.

She was one of six children. Rose Karn, Linda Chandler, Norma Roodhouse, Larry Steele, Patty Miller and Jerri Lynn Schaefer all grew up remaining close. Her love for family was rooted from her siblings and the love that they showed each other through the years. Patty leaves behind numerous nieces and nephews that will continue to remember their Aunt Pat fondly.

Patty started out as a waitress in her early days, working her way through school to become an educator and graduated from the University of Missouri St. Louis in 1988. She started working at Northwest School District in 1986 and remained there until her retirement in 2016/2017. Patty gave 30 years of her life, serving the children in the community and making sure they knew the importance, and impact a High School Diploma would mean. With her guidance, hundreds of students were able to call themselves graduates of

Northwest High School. Her actions did not go unnoticed, as she was a recipient of the Lifetime Achievement award from the Northwest Education Association and will be posthumously inducted as a Distinguished Educator into the Northwest Alumni Hall of Fame. She is loved and cherished throughout the district and made many friends through education.

She was a strong believer in her Faith, and knew she was a child of the Lord. She is walking again with her mother, Mary Anne Steele who she lost in 2016 and her grandson Tyler Shane, who passed away in 2010 at the age of 8.

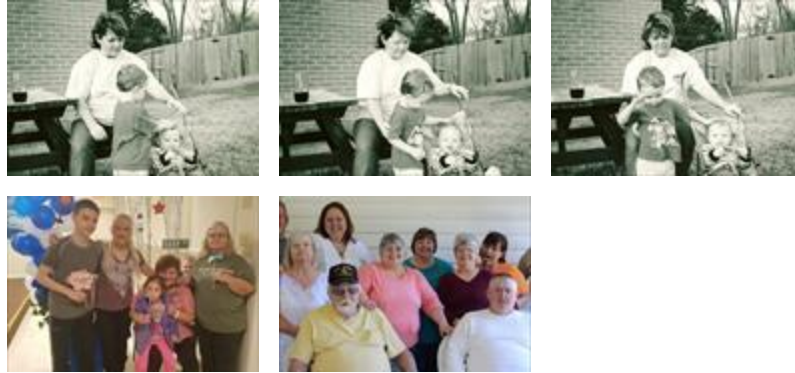

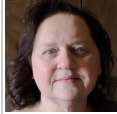
