They moved to Syracuse, New York where Dr. Richard Doisy took a position as Professor of Biochemistry at Syracuse University. Shirley was a nurse at Crouse-Hines Hospital until they adopted Alison in 1958. Shirley became a stay at home Mom and adopted David in 1960. Dr. Richard Doisy passed away in 1978 and Shirley went back to nursing at Crouse-Hines until she remarried Dr. Phillip Doisy in 1981 and moved to St. Louis where she became his office nurse.
