“ It hurts me to no end we lost the first born son of my youngest brother. Brian was so happy when Steven was born, the first in his big family.

Steven was proud too, when his first son was born. He had the same desires as his Dad, working hard toward goals to have a happy life, with those he loved.

He joined the Army right after his first was born. He told me joined to get an education, and gain the financial ability to provide a better future for his new family. Brian taught him the carpet trade at a very young age, and he was good at it. But he was looking to expand his knowledge and explore other careers. He put his life on the line every day in the horrible Afghanistan war to earn it. He did it for his country and his family. I can only imagine the horrors he witnessed, and the effect it had on him, even after his return home. He was safe from physical harm, but the psychological scars had an impact on the good-natured guy he was. There isn't near enough support for veterans returning from war torn tours of duty, to properly adjust to civilian life. He struggled, but life goes on. He put it behind him, but it was never forgotten, lingering in his mind, and working against his well being.

All Steven ever wanted was to have the love and approval of those he cared about. There were times when he didn't do the best thing for himself, and those he cared about it may have suffered for it too. But he kept trying to do the right thing. He loved his entire family more than anything. He tried so hard to earn the love and trust from them he desired.

He received the psychological support he needed, and was given vocational training to get a good job. I was so proud of him, and I think he was beginning to be proud of himself.

He got that good job as an over the road truck driver. When he was on the road, I'd send him messages, telling him I was thinking about him, to keep safe, I loved him, and was looking forward to visit when he came home. He would respond with love in his heart, grateful for

my concern. I wanted him to know he wasn't alone, but a part of my life.

With the success he achieved, he was saving money. He had always wanted a piece of property, where he would have a home to call his own. That was important to him. He wanted to be self sufficient.

Steven had a special place in my heart. I've always been close to him, in his good times and not so good times. No matter how things were going for him, he was always kind and respectful. He would offer to help me with anything I needed him for. He would tell me he was proud to help me because he loved me. He'd ask every time I'd see him if there was anything he could do for me. I appreciated him for being so considerate and unselfish, being there for me, even when he may have had trouble maintaining his own life. I stood by him in good time and bad times, because he was Steven, a good boy, and I loved him.

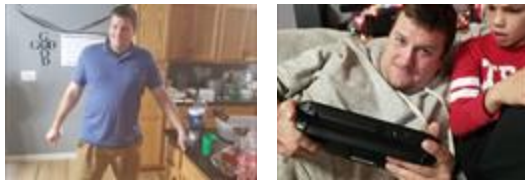
