



Trevor Dreyfus

May 13, 1983 - October 28, 2015

Dreyfus, Trevor James passed away on October 27, 2015. He grew up in Kirkwood and lived a very full life in his 32 years. He graduated from MICDS with top honors, was a national merit finalist and senior class president. He graduated magna cum laude from the College of William and Mary, where he double majored in International Relations and Economics and minored in Hispanic Studies. He spent seven months living and studying in Argentina, where he also earned his International Pilot's License for sailing. Upon graduation, he was awarded a year-long Fulbright Scholarship where he studied the effects of official currency dollarization on the economy of Ecuador. He then worked at the US Federal Trade Commission as an honors paralegal in the Bureau of Competition. He took a leave of absence for 6 months from the FTC to act as Logistics Specialist for working with the Eye of the World, an educational nonprofit organization in which he and 2 other crewmembers sailed from Virginia to the Galapagos Islands providing social studies lessons via streaming video to middle school classrooms in the US. Trevor then attended the London School of Economics, graduating with merit with a Masters of Science in International Political Economy. He took a job Louis Dreyfus Commodities upon graduation, working in international specialty coffee trading for the past 3 plus years in New Orleans, a city he loved. He travelled frequently in Central and South America, drawing upon his language skills in Spanish and Portuguese in his business efforts and personal explorations.

Beyond his accomplishments, Trevor was an athlete and adventurer, who loved to sail, kayak, and spend time in nature, but most of all loved being with family and friends. Trevor was loved dearly by many and his absence will leave an enormous void in the hearts of his family and friends. Trevor was the deeply beloved son of Dan Dreyfus and Denise Maue Dreyfus and deeply beloved brother of Nathan Thomas Maue Dreyfus. He was a beloved grandson, nephew and cousin, and valued friend of many, here and abroad

“ To the Dreyfus Family, Trevor was uncommonly good; his kindness and extraordinary sensitivity towards and consideration for others defined his personality and made him someone all could turn to for conversation, laughter, warmth and wit, and for a wisdom of conscience and spirit he was always developing with curiosity, integrity, and humility. He was expansive in everything he did, felt, and thought – sharing with openness and enthusiasm. Every Sunday at Goodenough College he would transform the Churchill Room into a space of silence and meditation; each of us joining him found peace and tranquility in those sessions as he guided us with irreverence and patience and no shortage of jokes. He taught us to tolerate and accept the ups and downs of meditation practice; of random thoughts and an unstill mind. With time, we learned to quiet our minds and find a place of calm and groundedness amid the cacophony of daily life; its desires and commitments and stresses and uncertainties. There was something so reassuring to both have this moment and space every week and to have Trevor be our guide and companion there. When our sessions ended I often felt a sense of release and well-being. Trevor helped me and us to transcend the mundane and to connect to something both very personal and individual in the sense of being able to sit with ourselves without fear and pretense and in honesty and also to simultaneously be open to and mindful of the pulse of life beyond our own individual selves and preoccupations. It was freeing and Trevor gave us that freedom.

I grieve his loss and feel his absence as palpably as I felt his presence. I carry and hold onto the memory of his smile and the twinkle in his eyes – loving and mischievous, funny and sharp, soft and sensitive to others but also so perceptive and aware as to be incisive but never in a way that was cutting. That twinkle – his entire being really – was and is a kind of talisman and a blessing; a reminder of how good human beings can be, how pure of intention and gentle of spirit, how filled with vitality and receptiveness to others, to nature, to ideas, to life. Trevor made my life and our community at Goodenough better; he made me and he made us more whole. I miss you so much Trevor.

You were honest and true in your interactions; you expressed gratitude and affection freely and generously and you cared deeply about others. You were playful and silly and joyful. To the Dreyfus family, we grieve with you and remember Trevor with love and infinite gratitude. May his spirit of compassion always be present in your life and a source of comfort. Love,
