



William Brian Woods

September 8, 1977 - August 16, 2009

Sergeant First Class William “Brian” Woods, Jr., originally of Catawissa, Missouri, proudly laid down his life for his country and our freedom, when he was KIA (Killed In Action) in Ghazni, Afghanistan and ultimately died at Landstuhl Regional Medical Center in Landstuhl, Germany 16 August 2009 from wounds suffered during Operation Enduring Freedom, assigned to the United States Army, Company B, 2nd Battalion, Special Forces Group, (Airborne) stationed out of Glen Arm, Maryland.

He is preceded in death by a son, Tookie Brian Woods, who is named after a dear friend and fellow soldier with whom Brian served and died January 29, 2008, his father, William Brian Woods, Sr., who served in the U.S. Marine Corps during Vietnam and died September 14, 2000 and his grandfather, John Woods who served in the Navy during World War II and died March 24, 2000.

Brian was an extraordinary husband and father and is survived by his wife, Elizabeth (nee Russell) Woods who is a native of Big Rapids, Michigan, and his two (2) daughters, Lily and Ella.

He is also survived by his mother, Pamela (nee Durbin) Woods, his sisters and brother, Katrina (husband, Mike) Kelemen, Pamela (husband, Steven) Strollo, Jesse Woods and Casey Woods, Elizabeth’s™ sisters, Jennifer

Like his father and grandfather before him, Brian was passionate about serving his country, serving in the Marines and Army prior to the Special Forces.

Brian will be remembered by family and friends at the following Events, with full military honors, beginning in Huntersville, North Carolina and concluding in St. Louis, Missouri. All Events are open to public for attending except for the Interment (Burial) and Memorial Park Cemetery.
